About this Course

Successful completion of this course including meeting the requirements of the Unit of Competency and making an application to Your Relevant State Regulator (SafeWork NSW, WorkSafe QLD or WorkSafe WA) results in a Nationally Recognised High Risk Work licence (SI).

This course is consisting of scaffolding work connected with the operation or use of cantilevered crane loading platforms, cantilevered scaffolds, spur scaffolds, barrow ramps, sloping platforms, scaffolding associated with perimeter safety screens and shutters, mast climbing work platforms, tube and coupler scaffolds (including tube and coupler covered ways and gantries) for licensing purposes.

This course covers the scope of work to plan the job, select and inspect equipment, set up task, erect scaffold and scaffold equipment and dismantle scaffold and scaffold equipment.

On successful completion of this course you will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for the following Unit of Competency;

CPCCLSF3001 - Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding intermediate level

You will also be issued with a Notice of Satisfactory Assessment (NSA); this is an interim licence issued by the Your Relevant State Regulator (SafeWork NSW, WorkSafe QLD or WorkSafe WA) Assessor when you pass your test. This training and assessment is conducted in line with requirements set out in the Conditions for conducting HRW licence assessments in Your Relevant State under the Work Health and Safety Regulation 2011



COURSE INFORMATION

This course is designed for experienced scaffolders that already hold a Scaffold Basic (SB) High Risk Work Licence. This course will help to refresh and advance your skills and knowledge). You will only be admitted into this Course if you meet the following pre-requisites:

- Are at least 18 years of age
- You can use English at a level that enables the safe performance of high risk work
- CPCCLSF2001 (or CPCCLSF2001A)- Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding basic level

You will receive instructions on how to access your online material within your booking confirmation email. You will be required to successfully complete the short online quiz before attending your course. Please make sure to read your learning material before attempting the quiz.

You will also have to complete a Language Literacy and Numeracy Assessment on arrival to the training centre. This will assist your trainer to determine if any reasonable adjustments are required to your training methods.

What is involved in getting a licence?

- 1 Book your course online or by calling us on

- 2 Study the pre-course learning materials, complete and pass the online quiz (100 % pass grade required)
- 3 Attend for your training days (as per your booking). Standard course requires four days of attendance to our custom designed training facility
- 4 Once you have met the requirements of the course (including practice tests) then you will be booked in to undertake your Relevant State Regulator Assessment (SafeWork NSW, WorkSafe QLD or WorkSafe WA) on our site. This test takes up to a full day depending on numbers. In NSW waiting times for assessment could be up to 14 days. This will allow you to study for your assessment.
- 5 Once you have passed your Relevant State Regulator Assessment then you will be issued with a Notice of Satisfactory Assessment. This document allows you to now erect, alter or dismantle a temporary structure within the scope of an Intermediate scaffolder!
- 6 NSW - Apply to SafeWork NSW and pay a fee at the Australia Post Office for a NSW HRW licence. This must be done within 60 days of successfully completing the practical assessment QLD -You will need to complete the online application and pay a fee at the WorkSafe QLD portal for a new Queensland HRW licence. This must be done within 60 days of successfully completing the practical assessment
- 7 WA - You will need to complete the online application and pay a fee at the WorkSafe WA portal for a new Western Australia HRW licence. This must be done within 60 days of successfully completing the practical assessment.
- 8 You will receive your photo licence in the mail directly from your Relevant State Regulator

Please note: Most people will not have any additional fees. As with all courses, there are terms and conditions covering additional training, re-assessment, and cancellations / rescheduling. Please refer to these on our website.



What is covered in the course?

YOU WILL GAIN THE FOLLOWING KNOWLEDGE

- Use of appropriate mathematical procedures for estimation and measurement of loads Commonwealth, state or territory OHS legislation and local government regulations, including standards and codes of practice relevant to the full range of techniques for undertaking Intermediate scaffolding activities
- Knowledge of principles relating to plant and equipment stability
- Knowledge of types of scaffolding and their application
- Knowledge of scaffolding erection, altering and dismantling techniques
- Knowledge of cantilevered crane-loading platform and equipment associated with Intermediate scaffolding and their use/s
- Risk assessment and control, including understanding of the hierarchy of control
- Estimation of bearing pressures of the full range of soil types and associated ground conditions for setting up plant and equipment
- Load capabilities of different types of scaffolding constructions
- Understanding and application of organisational and workplace standards, requirements, policies and procedures for Intermediate scaffolding
- Safety equipment applicable to Intermediate scaffolding
- Understanding and application of the inspection and maintenance requirements for Intermediate scaffold, associated equipment and scaffold equipment
- Uses and limitations of tools and equipment, appropriate to Intermediate scaffolding tasks and activities.

YOU WILL BE ABLE TO DEMONSTRATE THE FOLLOWING PERFORMANCE

- Scaffolding work involves erecting, altering or dismantling a temporary structure to support a platform from which a person or object could fall more than four metres.
- Ability to calculate Safe Working Load (SWL) and Working Load Limit (WLL)
- Ability to erect scaffold within the scope of the Intermediate scaffolder
- Ability to erect and dismantle cantilever crane-loading platform scaffolds
- Ability to interpret manufacturer's specifications for plant and equipment
- Ability to erect, alter and dismantle cantilevered and spur scaffolds
- Ability to erect and dismantle barrow ramps and sloping platform
- Ability to Erect and dismantle scaffolding associated with perimeter safety screens or shutters
- Ability Erect and dismantle mast climbing work platforms
- Ability to erect and dismantle tube and coupler scaffolds including tube and coupler covered ways and gantries
- Ability to work safely at heights
- Ability to work safely in confined spaces
- Accurate interpretation of basic structural charts and structural plans
- Correct application of all scaffolding equipment
- Methods for making temporary connection of static lines using Flexible Steel Wire Rope (FSWR)
- Verify problems and equipment faults and demonstrate appropriate response.

Other important information

WHO CAN DO THIS COURSE?

To participate in this course;

- You must be at least 18 yrs of age to commence the course;
- Your Relevant State Regulator Assessment requires that you are 18 years of age;
- Your Relevant State Regulator Assessment (test) requires that you have met all training and assessment requirements
- Have sufficient ID as required by your Relevant State Regulator – Refer to Your Relevant State Regulator Evidence of Identity Information Sheet for Participants of HRW Licence Assessment located on the website.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING?

- Your Relevant State Regulator issued High Risk Work Licence for Scaffolding Basic (SB)
- Wear long pants and a long sleeve shirt and closed shoes (preferable hard caps)

ENROLMENT

Enrolling into this course requires that you complete our enrolment form and provide sufficient 100 points of identification required by your state regulator. Once you have enrolled, then you will receive your Pre course Pack.
