About this Course

This Nationally Recognised course offered by Just Careers Training (RTO ID 91413) trading as Licences 4 Work.

The Provide First Aid unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to infants, children and adults. The unit applies to educators and support staff working within an education and care setting who are required to respond to a first aid emergency, including asthmatic and anaphylactic emergencies.

This unit of competency may contribute towards approved first aid, asthma and anaphylaxis training under the Education and Care Services National Law, and the Education and Care Services National Regulations (2011).

Specific licensing requirements, including requirements for refresher training, should be obtained from the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) and/or relevant state/territory Work Health and Safety Regulatory Authority.

This course includes the requirements of the Provide First Aid and Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certificate and the requirements of the HLTAID010 Provide Basic Emergency Life Support. This provides participants with the theoretical knowledge and practical skills required to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies.

PREREQUISITES

There are no pre-requisites or co-requisites for this competency unit.

For the Advanced Option you must hold a current unexpired certificate for the same course.

COURSES ON OFFER

Standard Course - This option is suitable for those who do not hold a current First Aid certificate or have attained their previous certificate more than 3 years ago (calculated at the time of attendance). This option is also suitable for those that have a current or First Aid certificate and who would like to renew/update their certificates as recommended every three years. Please refer to our website for any promotional prices (is on promotion from time to time).

Advanced / Refresher - This option is suitable for those who hold a current First Aid certificate or have attained their previous certificate more than 3 years ago (calculated at the time of attendance). Please refer to our website for any promotional prices (is on promotion from time to time).

MODE OF DELIVERY & DURATION

Face-to-Face Standard/ Refresher Part 1

- For Standard this involves pre-course training (self-study) and a mandatory pre-course quiz to be completed before attendance.
- For Advanced / Refresher no pre-course study required simply bring the original copy of your current unexpired (3 years from date of issue) certificate

For Standard and Advanced Options - theory and practical training (8:30am until around 4pm) followed by assessment

ASSESSMENTS AND TESTS

Attaining your Statement of Attainment for this course involves attending your course, undertaking training, completing theory and practical activities and undertaking a final assessment. You will only be permitted to undertake final assessments if you feel you are ready, and your trainer/assessor allows you to undertake assessment (and this is based on your participation and completion of activities).

Current industry standard is for this course to be updated every 3 years with the CPR component being updated every 12 months.

Knowledge and Performance Outcomes

Specifically, you will cover the following skills and knowledge:

PERFORMANCE EVIDENCE

- Following DRSABCD in line with arc guidelines, including:
- Performing uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) (5 cycles of both compressions and ventilations) on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor
- Performing uninterrupted single rescuer CPR (5 cycles both compressions and ventilations) on a child resuscitation manikin placed on the floor
- Performing uninterrupted single rescuer CPR (5 cycles both compressions and ventilations) on an infant resuscitation manikin placed on a firm surface
- Responding appropriately in the event of regurgitation or vomiting
- Managing the unconscious breathing casualty
- Following single rescue procedure, including the demonstration of a rotation of operators with minimal interruptions to compressions
- Following the prompts of an automated external defibrillator (AED)
- Responding to first aid scenarios contextualised to the candidate's workplace/community setting,

- and involving infants and children of varying ages including:
- Conducting a visual and verbal assessment of the casualty
- Demonstrating safe manual handling techniques
- Post-incident debriefing and evaluation
- Providing an accurate verbal and written report of the incident
- Conducting a hazard assessment and identified strategies to minimise risk
- Applying first aid procedures for the following:
 allergic reaction, anaphylaxis, bleeding
 control, choking and airway obstruction,
 envenomation, using pressure immobilisation,
 fractures, sprains and strains, using arm
 slings, roller bandages or other appropriate
 immobilisation principles techniques, head
 injuries, poisoning, respiratory distress, including
 asthma, seizures & convulsions, including febrile
 convulsions and epilepsy, shock
- Locating and interpreting workplace policies and procedures

KNOWLEDGE

- State/territory regulations, first aid codes of practice and workplace procedures including:
- Arc guidelines for provision of CPR and first aid to infants, children and adults
- Guidelines from australian national peak clinical bodies
- Safe work practices to minimise risks and potential hazards
- First aid requirements for services under the education and care services national law
- Infection control principles and procedures, including use of standard precautions
- Requirements for currency of skill and knowledge
- Legal, workplace and community considerations, including:
- Awareness of potential need for stressmanagement techniques and available support following an emergency situation, including the psychological impact on children
- Duty of care requirements
- Respectful behaviour towards a casualty
- Own skills and limitations
- Consent, including situations in which parental/ caregiver consent is required
- Privacy and confidentiality requirements
- Importance of debriefing
- Considerations when providing first aid including:
- Airway obstruction due to body position
- Appropriate duration and cessation of CPR
- Appropriate use of an AED, including placement of pads for adults and children aged older than 8 years
- Specific considerations when using an AED on children aged between 1 and 8 years, including identification of AED with paediatric capability, paediatric voltage and use of paediatric pads
- Chain of survival.

- Standard precautions
- How to conduct a visual and verbal assessment of the casualty
- Principles and procedures for application of first aid management of the following scenarios: abdominal injuries, allergic reaction, anaphylaxis, including signs, symptoms and triggers and using different types of adrenaline auto injectors, asthma, including signs, symptoms and triggers and using different types of bronchodilators, basic care of a wound, bleeding control, burns, cardiac conditions, including chest pain, choking and airway obstruction, crush injuries, diabetes, dislocations, drowning, envenomation, environmental impact, including hypothermia, hyperthermia, dehydration and heat stroke, eye and ear injuries, febrileconvulsions, fractures, head, neck and spinal injuries, minor skin injuries, needle stick injuries, poisoning and toxic substances, respiratory distress, seizures, including epilepsy, shock, soft tissue injuries, including sprains and strains, stroke, unconsciousness
- Basic anatomy and physiology relating to:
- How to recognise a person is not breathing normally
- Chest
- Infant respiratory systems and implications for provision of CPR
- Basic anatomical differences between adults and children, and the implications for provision of first aid
- Normal clinical values for children
- Response/consciousness
- Upper airway and effect of positional change
- Poisoning and toxic substance exposure; respiratory distress; cardiac arrest; shock; and seizures.
