About this Course

Successful completion of this course including meeting the requirements of the unit of Competency and making an application to Your Relevant State Regulator (SafeWork NSW, WorkSafe QLD, WorkSafe VIC or WorkSafe WA) results in a Nationally Recognised High Risk Work licence (SI).

This course is consisting of scaffolding work connected with the operation or use of modular or pre-fabricated scaffolds, cantilevered materials hoists with a maximum working load of 500kg, ropes and gin wheels, safety nets and static lines, and bracket scaffolds (tank and formwork) for licensing purposes.

This course covers the scope of work to plan the job, select and inspect equipment, set up task, undertake intermediate scaffolding activities and then complete the task.

On successful completion of this course you will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for the following Unit of Competency;

CPCCLSF3001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding intermediate level

You will also be issued with a Notice of Satisfactory Assessment (NSA); this is an interim licence issued by the Your Relevant State Regulator's Assessor (SafeWork NSW, WorkSafe QLD, WorkSafe VIC or WorkSafe WA) when you pass your assessment. This training and assessment is conducted in line with requirements set out in the Conditions for Conducting HRW Licence Assessments in NSW, QLD, VIC and WA under the Commonwealth Work Health and Safety Act 2011 and Work Health and Safety Regulation 2011 and relevant applicable acts in each state.



COURSE INFORMATION

This course is designed for experiennced scaffolders. This cours will help to refresh and advance your skills and knowledge. You will only be admitted into this Course if you meet the following pre-requisites:

- CPCCLSF2001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding basic level.
- Are at least 18 years of age
- You can use English at a level that enables the safe performance of high risk work

You will receive instructions on how to access your online material within your booking confirmation email. It is highly recommended that you access and commence reviewing your learning material prior to attend the training with us. You will also have to complete a Language Literacy and Numeracy Assessment on arrival to the training centre. This will assist your trainer to determine if any reasonable adjustments are required to your training methods.

What is involved in getting a licence?

- 2 Study the pre-course materials, in preparation to attending your training facility (100% pass grade required)
- Attend for your training days (as per your booking). Standard course requires four days of attendance to our custom designed training facility.
- Once you have met the requirements of this course (including practice tests) you will then be booked in to undertake your Relevant State Regulator Assessment (SafeWork NSW, WorkSafe QLD, WorkSafe VIC or WorkSafe WA) at our site. This assessment takes up to a full day depending on numbers. In NSW waiting times for assessment could be up to 14 days. This will allow you to study for your assessment.
 - If you are in NSW, you must ensure you have an active Service NSW account and have applied and received your Assessment Enrolment Number (AEN), prior to attending your assessment.
- Once you have passed your Relevant State Regulator Assessment you will then be issued with a Notice of Satisfactory Assessment. This document allows you to now erect, alter or dismantle a temporary structure within the scope of a intermediate scaffolder!
- Apply for your HRW Licence within 60 days of successfully completing the assessments.
 - NSW Apply to Service NSW for your National High Risk Work Licence (LF Class) within 60 days at a Service NSW Centre
 - QLD Complete the online application and pay a fee via the WorkSafe QLD portal
 - WA Complete the online application and pay a fee at the WorkSafe WA portal
 - VIC Complete the online application and pay a fee at the WorkSafe VIC portal
- You will receive your photo licence in the mail directly from your Relevant State Regulator (WA, QLD, VIC only).

Please note: Most people will not have any additional fees. As with all courses, there are terms and conditions covering additional training, re-assessment, and cancellations / rescheduling. Please refer to these on our website.

What is covered in the course?

YOU WILL GAIN THE FOLLOWING KNOWLEDGE:

- Use of appropriate mathematical procedures for estimation and measurement of loads Commonwealth, state or territory WHS/OHS legislation and local government regulations, including standards and codes of practice relevant to the full range of techniques for undertaking Intermediate scaffolding activities
- Knowledge of principles relating to plant and equipment stability
- Knowledge of types of scaffolding and their application
- Knowledge of scaffolding erection, altering and dismantling techniques
- Knowledge of cantilevered crane-loading platform and equipment associated with Intermediate scaffolding and their use/s
- Risk assessment and control, including understanding of the hierarchy of control

- Estimation of bearing pressures of the full range of soil types and associated ground conditions for setting up plant and equipment
- Load capabilities of different types of scaffolding constructions
- Understanding and application of organisational and workplace standards, requirements, policies and procedures for Intermediate scaffolding
- Safety equipment applicable to Intermediate scaffolding
- Understanding and application of the inspection and maintenance requirements for Intermediate scaffold, associated equipment and scaffold equipment
- Uses and limitations of tools and equipment, appropriate to Intermediate scaffolding tasks and activities.

YOU WILL BE ABLE TO DEMONSTRATE THE FOLLOWING PERFORMANCE:

- Scaffolding work involves erecting, altering or dismantling a temporary structure to support a platform from which a person or object could fall more than four metres.
- Ability to calculate Safe Working Load (SWL) and Working Load Limit (WLL)
- Ability to erect scaffold within the scope of the Intermediate scaffolder
- Ability to erect and dismantle cantilever craneloading platform scaffolds
- Ability to interpret manufacturer's specifications for plant and equipment
- Ability to erect, alter and dismantle cantilevered and spur scaffolds
- Ability to erect and dismantle barrow ramps and sloping platform
- Ability to Erect and dismantle scaffolding

- associated with perimeter safety screens or shutters
- Ability Erect and dismantle mast climbing work platforms
- Ability to erect and dismantle tube and coupler scaffolds including tube and coupler covered ways and gantries
- Ability to work safely at heights
- Ability to work safely in confined spaces
- Accurate interpretation of basic structural charts and structural plans
- Correct application of all scaffolding equipment
- Methods for making temporary connection of static lines using Flexible Steel Wire Rope (FSWR)
- Verify problems and equipment faults and demonstrate appropriate response.



OUTCOME

On successful completion of this course, you will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for the following Unit of Competency;

CPCCLSF3001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding intermediate level

Best Practice

Nationally Recognised Training

It is recommended that Verification of Competency (VOC) assessments for High-Risk Work Licences (HRWL) be carried out every 12 to 24 months. Although HRWLs are generally valid for five years, more frequent VOC assessments or refresher training may be advised or required to maintain ongoing competency and compliance with safety standards.

Industry standards and workplace policies may require more frequent VOC assessments or refresher training to ensure workers maintain competency in their roles. This also helps keep workers informed about the latest safety procedures, equipment usage, and regulatory updates.

- Some Pre-Course Work may be required

WHO CAN DO THIS COURSE?

To participate in this course;

- Your Relevant State Regulator Assessment requires that you are 18 years of age;
- Your Relevant State Regulator Assessment (test requires that you have met all training and assessment requirements
- Have sufficient ID as required by your Relevant State Regulator – Refer to Your Relevant State Regulator Evidence of Identity Information Sheet for Participants of HRW Licence Assessment located on the website.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING?

- Your Relevant State Regulator issued High Risk Work Licence for Scaffolding Basic (SB)
- Wear long pants and a long sleeve shirt and closed shoes (preferable hard caps)

ENROLMENT

Enrolling into this course requires that you complete our enrolment form and provide sufficient 100 points of identification as required by your state regulator. Once you have enrolled, then you will receive access to your online portal.

ADDITIONAL TRAINING & REFRESHER

Additional training is available at a rate of \$100 per half hour. For refresher training, contact us.

ASSESSMENT ONLY

If you have completed and attained a Statement of Attainment from an RTO and are eligible to be assessed or reassessed (reassessment fees will apply. Please contact us for requirements).

If you are in **NSW**:

On your scheduled assessment day, you must bring with you ONE form of Photo ID (must be the same ID used for your Service NSW account setup) and your Assessment enrolment letter sent to you from SafeWork NSW (you will apply for your AEN via your Service NSW account). Failure to provide the above mentioned will result in a reschedule of your assessment (fees and charges apply, please refer to our website for the current Terms & Conditions).

COMPLAINTS AND APPEALS

If you disagree with the outcome of your assessment, or are not satisfied with the services of the RTO has a fair and transparent complaints and appeals procedure summarised at the end of this course brochure.

LANGUAGE, LITERACY & NUMERACY REQUIREMENTS

This course is delivered in English. To be able to successfully complete our training programs, participants must be able to read and write English to a sufficient standard to work with the supplied texts. You may also be requested to undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy assessment.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

This is a process whereby you present evidence of your competency to your assessor who will then assess your evidence against the requirements of the course. Should the evidence meet the requirements of one or more units (even the whole qualification) then you may be awarded the unit(s) and not require any training or assessment. Where the evidence presented does not meet the requirements then you may apply to attempt an assessment only process to provide the required evidence or simply return to completing the required training followed by assessment.
